Advent, Then and Now

The church season of Advent began as a time of repentance for Epiphany, which was the second-biggest baptism day in the early church. Fasting was once a part of Advent, as it often still is for Lent.

Advent comes from the Greek word *parousia*, which was often used to talk about Jesus' second coming. So Advent is a season of preparation not only for the celebration of Jesus' earthly birth but for his promised return.

Some Christians celebrate Advent by not putting the baby Jesus into their manger scenes until Christmas morning. This adds to the anticipation that is a special part of the season.

NHLC Council Minutes November 15, 2010

Members Present: Ginger Shomberg, Kristy Meyer, Bill Montelbano, Tricia Passage, Pastor Rob, Don Wallace, Dave Seymour

Opening Devotions: Pastor Rob led devotions

Secretary's Report: Ginger made a motion to approve the secretary's report, second by Kristy, carried.

Treasurer's Report: Giving is down this month. There was a \$2100 worship expense this month for band equipment. We owe \$1100 to Sugar Creek for Vacation Bible School counselors. Budget is up \$3500 for the year. We had larger than normal bank fees in September because of the number of transactions that were made (this was not a problem with Black Earth State bank, but reflects a change in policy by Cross Plains State Bank). Don made a motion to switch from Cross Plains State Bank to People Community Bank in Mazomanie if we can't get the transaction limit lifted by the end of the year, seconded by Pastor Rob, carried. Motion to approve treasurer's report made by Pastor Rob, seconded by Bill, carried.

Pastor's Report:

Surveys were mailed out to the congregation and we have received about 20 back. Pastor Rob hopes to get more back in the next couple of weeks.

Had a high school lock-in with about 30 kids.

The Holy Spirit Retreat is planned for Dec 3-4th and will be co-lead by Pastor Rob and Pastor Couper.

Christmas program is scheduled for December 19.

Excited about "Befrienders", a care giving ministry in the works.

Old Business:

Rezoning was approved and we were able to avoid the Rezoning fees of \$10,000. We will be hiring an attorney to draft a formal offer to purchase.

The loan application is being finished and will be submitted.

We will not make any determinations on renting the land until after the land purchase closes.

We still need a volunteer to clear the sidewalks after a snowfall in the morning. One option is to hire a high school student to do it before school.

The Future Facilities Taskforce will meet to discuss a timeline and make plans for putting our buildings for sale and moving our worship services into one space. This is expected to be a long process and will be carefully planned.

New Business:

We will be doing some stewardship work coming up possibly this spring.

Pastor Rob recommended that we use the same offering counting system in Black Earth as in Mazo where the money is counted after worship and deposited into the bank on Sunday after worship.

Motion made by Don to purchase a thank you gift card for Barb Beckman for her many years of service as financial secretary in Black Earth, seconded by Bill, carried.

Went over any possible major expenses for 2011 budget. Officers will be meeting this week to talk about the budget.

Motion made by Pastor Rob to adjourn, seconded by Don, carried.

Closed in prayer

Next meeting is scheduled for December 20 at 6:00 pm in Black Earth.

THANKSGIVING NAME CARDS

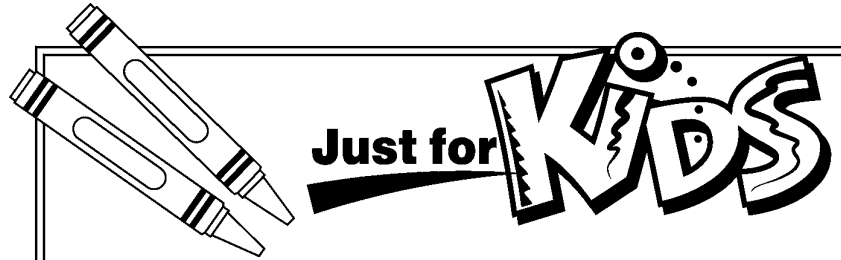
When you set your table this Thanksgiving, use these homemade name cards with a special message for each guest.

What you need:

- Index cards, any size (one per person)
- Markers
- Fall stickers (optional)
- Fall foam shapes (optional)

What you do:

1. List everyone who will be at your Thanksgiving dinner.
2. Fold each index card in half so it can stand.
3. On one side of each card, write a person's name.
4. Decorate around each name with markers, stickers or foam shapes.
5. On the blank side of each card, write a different Bible verse about blessings or giving thanks. Suggestions include 1 Chronicles 16:34; 1 Chronicles 29:13; Psalm 107:8; Psalm 118:21, 28; or 1 Thessalonians 5:18.
6. Another idea is to write one or more words from one verse on each person's card (depending on the number of guests and words). You can write the verse in order and have people read around the table, or you can mix up the words so guests have to put them in the correct order. (Remember to list the Scripture reference.)

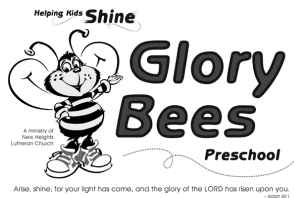
